LIFEGROUPS

QUICK REVIEW

Thinking back to the weekend sermon, "Jesus Tried and Denied," summarize the main point in a sentence or two.

Was there anything you heard for the first time or that caught your attention, challenged, or confused you?

Do you plan on taking any practical steps this week in response to the message?

GETTING STARTED

Think back to a time when you failed. What was the most important lesson you learned through that experience?

What's your favorite movie, television show, or book based in the courtroom?

This is the last Life Group meeting in our series on Mark's Gospel. What is something that you learned or surprised you in our study of Mark?

DIGGING DEEPER

1. Read Hebrews 1:1-14. How would you summarize this message about Jesus in your own words?

How does this depiction of Jesus compare or contrast with the depiction of Jesus in other places in scripture?

How might this passage shape our understanding of Christ's abandonment, denial, and eventually his death?

In verses 5-14, the author reminds us that the Son is greater than the angels. Is there anything in your life today about which you need the reminder that Jesus is greater?

Do you think a passage like this should impact how we live, or is it just something good for us to know?

2. In the message this weekend, I shared that Jesus doesn't need our perfection, but he wants our repentance. A great example of repentance is found in Luke 19:1-10. Read the passage together. When talking with Zacchaeus, Jesus didn't mention anything about money, sin, or the need to repent. What do you think it was about their interaction that caused such a change in Zacchaeus?

How did Zacchaeus demonstrate true repentance?

How did Zacchaeus' commitment to repentance impact his community?

Do you think your commitment to repentance should have an impact on those in your sphere of influence? If so, how?

How should Jesus' mission statement in v.10 shape who we share the gospel with and how we do it?
