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QUICK REVIEW

Thinking back to the weekend sermon, "What To Remember," summarize the main point in a sentence or two.

Looking at your notes, was there anything you heard for the first time or that caught your attention, challenged, or confused you?

Do you plan on taking any practical steps this week in response to the message?

GETTING STARTED

Why do you think Jesus gave us a meal to remember His sacrifice on the cross?

When asked to describe the church, do you think those outside it would describe it as a place of grace? Why or why not?

DIGGING DEEPER

1. What would you say if someone asked you to explain why Christians celebrate the Lord's Supper?

In 1 Corinthians 11:23-29, Paul gives the church detailed instructions for how to observe the Lord's Supper. What stands out to you in this passage?

In verse 28, we see that God's judgment is one reason Paul instructs us to examine ourselves. What do you think of when you hear the term "self-examination"?

How might self-examination grow someone's appreciation for Christ's death, grace received, and entry into the Kingdom?

What can we do to ensure that the Lord's Supper does not become an empty ritual?

2. In the message, Pastor Rick shared that the Lord's Supper is an invitation to receive Christ's grace. One Old Testament passage that reminds us of God's grace is Psalm 51. Read the passage together. What prompted the writing of this psalm?

Knowing the reasoning behind the psalm, what does it communicate about the scope of grace?

How does the way the world deals with sin differ from the way God deals with it?

How could this psalm be used as a testimony and message of encouragement to our community?

What lines in the psalm jump out to you?

FOR PRACTICE

In the classic work Life Together, Dietrich Bonhoeffer states, "Christianity means community through Jesus Christ and in Jesus Christ... We belong to one another only through and in Jesus Christ." We are joined to one another because we are joined to Christ, and similarly, we cannot separate ourselves from one another because we are joined in Christ. Is there a brother or sister you are joined to but have separated yourself from? Ask the Lord to help you seek or extend forgiveness to that person this week. Consider putting your unity with Christ into action by seeking unity and peace with your Christian brother or sister.

SHARE IT

Is there anything you heard or learned in the weekend message or Life Group this week that you want to share with someone you know?
